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Can Qatar's energy demand be met by 800 MW solar plant? The energy minister claims 10% of Qatar???s peak electricity demand can be met by the 800 MW plant. The Qatar General Electricity and Water Corp (Kahramaa) has announced a joint bid by French fossil fuel company Total and Japanese conglomerate Marubeni Corp has won the 800 MW solar tender launched last year.



Who owns Qatar's new solar plant? The Qatari utility said the resulting solar project, originally conceived as a 700 MW facility, will be built on a 10km? plot in Al-Kharsaah, west of Doha, for QAR1.7 billion (\$467 million). The solar plant will be 60% owned by the Siraj Energyjoint venture formed by Qatar Petroleum and the utility and 40% by the French-Japanese consortium.



The Group recently completed the construction of a 60-megawatt power plant and an energy storage system in Mangilao, Guam. In addition to solar power plants, Samsung C& T is actively strengthening its portfolio of new ???
